The mission of Heritage Christian School is to glorify God through the discipleship of students and the pursuit of excellence in education with the Bible as the foundation and Jesus Christ as our focus.

Heritage Christian School was founded in 1965 as a private, non-denominational PrepK-12 school, and adheres to the doctrinal statement of the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). It is intended that each student will obtain a Christ-centered and Biblically integrated education with an emphasis on academic excellence.

Heritage Christian High School is a college preparatory program, enrolling approximately 400 students. Heritage was recently named the top school in Central Indiana for producing college ready graduates, based on data from the Indiana Commission for Higher Education. It is a unique and challenging program with a variety of distinctive opportunities that provide exceptional college and career preparation. Those opportunities include an annual Internship Experience; extensive fine arts, athletic, and extracurricular activities with high standards of performance, resulting in many awards and recognitions; a specialized Academics program that provides focused course planning toward specific college and career choices; a 1:1 digitally integrated classroom environment; a track record of outstanding academic excellence; and a consistent and strong culture of character and values, maintained through a discipleship-driven and relational environment. In addition, the culture maintains a strong sense of family and community, with numerous activities and events that build memories and strengthen bonds.

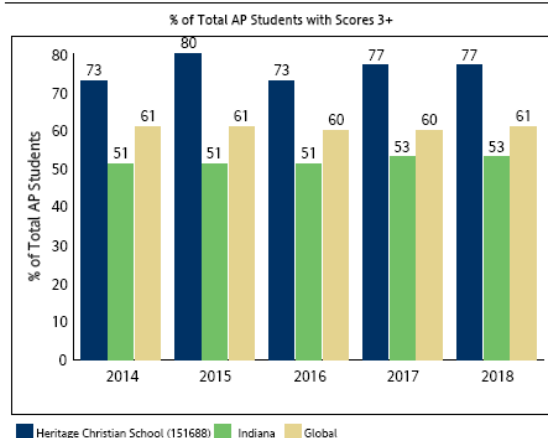

"Success" on an AP Exam is defined as an exam score of 3 or higher, which represents the score point that research finds predictive of college success and college graduation. These findings have held consistent across the decades. One example of such a study comes from the National Center for Educational Accountability, which found that an AP Exam score, and a score of 3 or higher in particular, is a strong predictor of a student's ability to persist in college and earn a bachelor's degree.

The data in this report differs from other College Board reports, such as *The AP Cohort Data Report*, which tracks exams taken by seniors throughout their time in high school (cohort-based) and includes public school data only.

Weighted Grades: Heritage uses a weighted grade system. All AP, Honors, and dual credit college courses will be weighted. Each semester, after the cumulative GPA is calculated, the following point values will be added to determine the official weighted GPA: all AP and dual credit courses will receive a point value of .025 per semester, and all Honors courses will receive a point value of .0125 per semester.
